PCC Community Services is run by volunteers. Our volunteers organize the food truck, food pantry and maintain our warehouse. Our warehouse has items for families such as; clothing, shoes, coats, household items. They also organize and run our yearly Christmas Project.



## **Services:**

### **Family Fund:**

Donations solicited and used for concrete needs of active PCC clients when other agencies have not been able to help. This fund has been used for medication co-pays, educational costs for kids entering college, car insurance and vehicle repairs, and many other concrete items.

### **Christmas Project:**

Our annual Christmas fund has assisted low income PCC client children with food and Christmas gifts when other agencies or Christmas drives have not been able to help.

### **Food Bank:**

Our community food bank, administered by The Foodbank of Eastern Michigan, provides food at no charge to the area's needy.

### **Mall Warehouse:**

Our mall warehouse is filled with new and gently used donated items for families. All families are vetted and referred.

## **Grants:**

PCCCS was delighted to receive financial support from the Food Bank of Eastern Michigan Capacity Building Grant. The funds supported the attainment of a refrigerator, grocery bags, and an aluminum handcart. These items assisted PCCCS in tripling the number of food trucks that occurred in FY 2022-2023.
